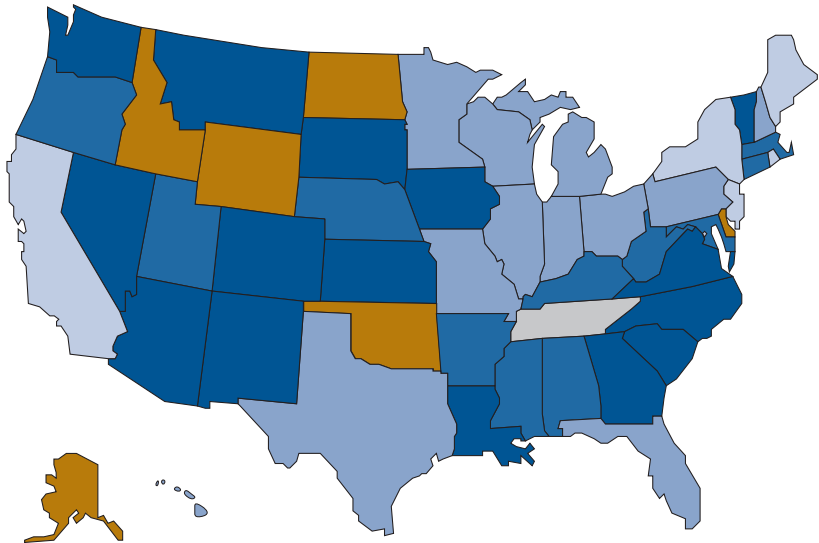


WHAT DO STATES PAY FOR PRIMARY CARE?

In most states, Medicaid pays less for primary care services than Medicare and private insurers do under fee-for-service. But in some states, Medicaid is relatively generous when it comes to pay, so boosting primary care rates to Medicare levels for 2013 and 2014 will have little or no effect.

- 100% and above
- 84%-75%
- 54% and below
- 99%-85%
- 74%-55%
