

## MOST REMAINING UNINSURED ARE EXEMPT FROM MANDATE

Most of the roughly 20 million individuals who are expected to remain uninsured after health system reforms take effect will not be subject to tax penalties for lacking coverage. These figures simulate the impact of the law if it had been implemented in 2011.

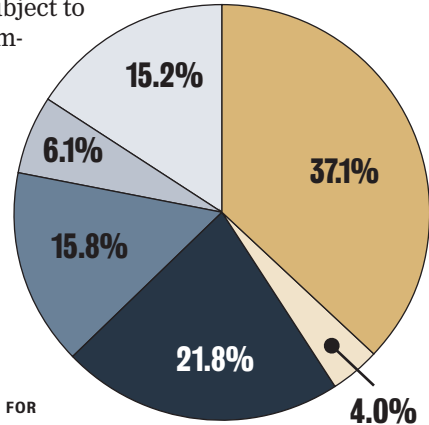
### THE UNINSURED AFTER HEALTH REFORM

#### Exempt from the penalty:

- Illegal immigrants
- Low income, no tax required
- Coverage costs > 8% of income
- Uninsured less than three months

#### Subject to the penalty:

- Paying the penalty
- Not paying the penalty
