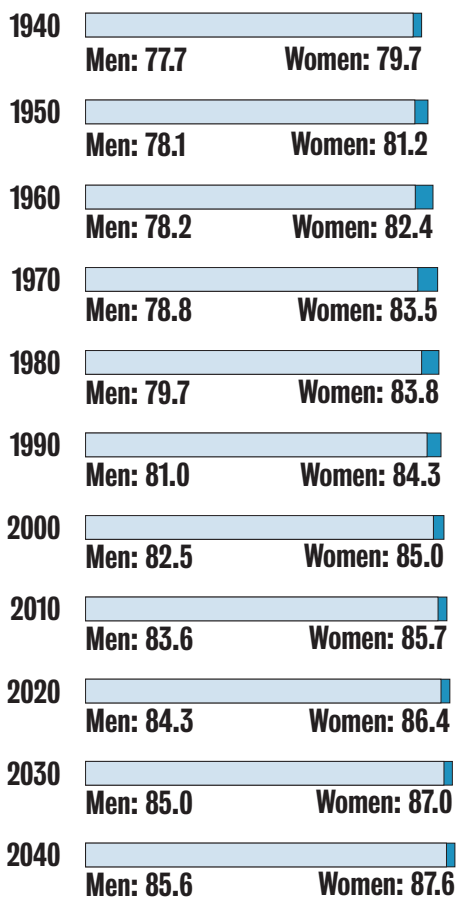


LIFESPAN DRIVES MEDICARE ELIGIBILITY DEBATE

In 1940, seniors turning 65 could expect to live only another 14 years. In 2010, those reaching eligibility age for Medicare could expect to live another 20 years — and spend about 30% of their adult lives in retirement. These figures are life expectancies for those turning 65 in any given year.
