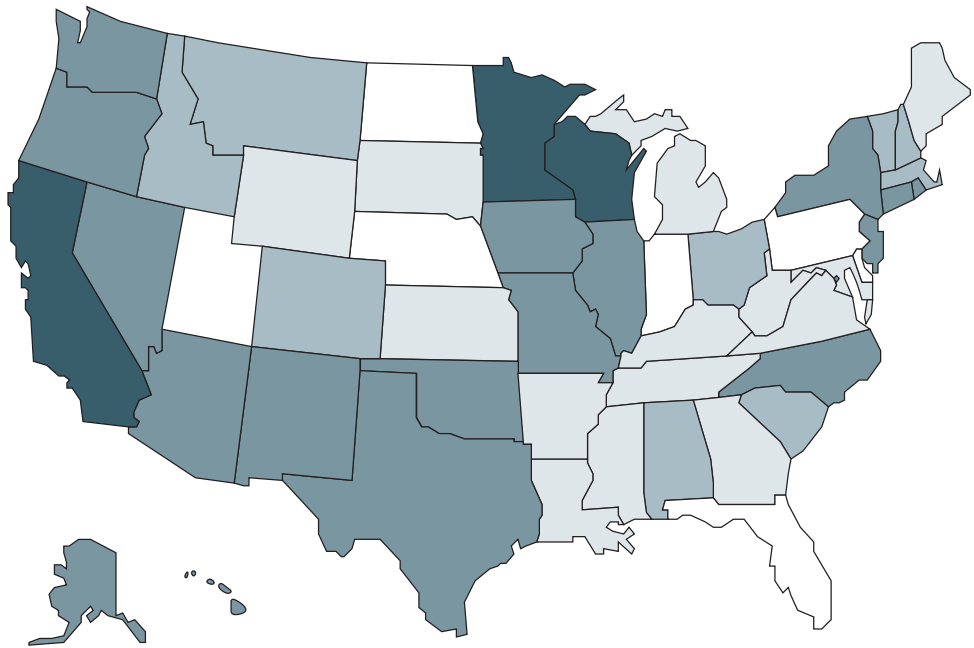


STATES ACTING EARLY ON NEW MEDICAID OPTIONS

Only seven states – California, Colorado, Connecticut, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey and Washington – and the District of Columbia have started offering Medicaid to additional adults ahead of the 2014 expansion of the program. But most states have pursued at least one of the other options offered by the national health system reform law to improve Medicaid, which are upgrading eligibility systems, dedicating funding to disease prevention, moving forward on establishing health homes, and integrating or aligning care for Medicare-Medicaid dual eligibles.
